1. Introduction and Context

1.1 Introduction

This paper provides summary 16-19 information at the Local Authority District Level. It has been produced to inform the 14-19 Local Area Plan and the commissioning of 16-19 provision for the Local Authority area.

This data pack uses a variety of sources to provide background information on Demand issues such as local unemployment; employment patterns, deprivation and demand for skills in the local authority area. It also provides trend data on cohort size, participation and achievement for young people aged 16-19 resident in the local authority area.

It is intended that the pack will assist the LA, LSC and 14-19 Partnership with their decisions in regard to strategic direction for 14-19 commissioning of places and IAG. It is supported by the LSC's area profiles, Regional Strategic Analysis (available 30th September) and the 14-19 modelling toolkit which provides target information. All of these should be used in conjunction to assist with the 16-19 part of 14-19 commissioning and strategic planning.

The data pack and tools are produced with data as available at 31st August 2008. Since they are web based, they will be updated periodically until 31st January 2009 as more timely data becomes available. Each pack contains data tables/maps/ charts relevant to the demand and supply of education and skills for 16-18 year olds. The pack also contains a one page summary of the key demand and supply issues which are relevant to 14-19 commissioning to assist with strategic planning.

1.2 Context

Employment in Lincolnshire is robust. The level of economic inactivity (19%) and unemployment (5.1%) is lower than both that in the region and that in England as a whole. The largest number of employers is to be found in agriculture, retail and property/business services. Compared to the region as a whole, there are fewer employers in the sectors of production and finance. The greatest proportions of employees are to be found in production, retail, health and property/business services. Whilst fifteen percent of the employers in the county are in the agriculture sector, this sector only employs 1.4% of the total number of employees.

Lincolnshire has a greater proportion of workers employed in the skilled trades and in sales and customer services than in the region as a whole, but there are less people employed in the professions than in the region. Vacancy rates, and Hard to Fill vacancy rates are higher than those in the East Midlands and have both increased over the last two years. Skill shortage vacancies have fallen over the last two years and are lower than the region as a whole. Employers in Lincolnshire are more likely to recruit 17-18 year olds than they will 16 year olds or graduates.

Overall demand for skills for the future is highest in health and social work, retail distribution, business services and education. It will be important to ensure that there is sufficient training supply in these sectors in the near future. Demand is lower in sectors such as textiles, manufacturing and computing. Future commissioning of training places will need to ensure this fall off in demand is managed. There will be a very high demand for managers in the next few years in Lincolnshire. Employees to fill vacancies in Caring occupations, Sales and Teaching/research will also be in demand.

The levels of qualification in the population are poorer than those in the region in general and in England. 65% of the population has a level 2 qualification and 43% a level 3. 23% are qualified to level 4 or above. Thirty five percent have qualifications below level 2. For the East Midlands this is 33%.

The 14-19 cohort has been increasing in Lincolnshire, but is due to peak in 2009/10 with a 4% fall predicted to the following year. Participation in education of 16 and 17 year olds is not a strength in the county. Only 76% were in education and training in 2006 post 16 compared to 80% in England. This proportion has fallen (1%) since the previous year. There are significant differences between participation at 16 and that at 17. Participation fell off by 12% between the ages of 16 and 17 in 2006. This is similar to the national trend. However, the trend in participation amongst 17 year olds in Lincolnshire has fallen by 3% between 2005 and 2006 and is now below the 2004 level. It is also below regional and England averages. The trend in those Not in Education, Employment or Training (NEET) is a downward one. In May 2008 it stood at 2.8% a fall of 0.2% compared to the same period in 2007. This is the lowest NEET percentage in the region. Unemployment amongst the 16-18 year old population rises steadily between 2004 and 2006, but 2007 saw a small fall to 15%. This is however higher than both the region and England (10.8%).

More young people choose to learn in School Sixth Forms (SSF) in Lincolnshire than in the region as a whole. A very small percentage of those who select school sixth form travel to Nottinghamshire to study. Participation in both SSF and Apprenticeships is now rising. Participation in Further Education (FE) showed a small decrease between 2006/07 and 2007/08. 85% of those who attend FE colleges do so within Lincolnshire.

Achievement at level 2 and 3 by 19 is better than regional averages. At 73% for level 2, Lincolnshire is well above both the regional but below the England averages. When English and maths are taken into account, however (49.6%) Lincolnshire is above both region and England. The picture is similar for level 3 at 47%. The strong performance of young people at 16 assists in this picture. Achievement of level two in 2007 was 65% compared to the national average of 61%. The results for boys are, as in the rest of the country, lower than those of girls.

The proportion of young people achieving a full level 2 with English and Maths between 16 and 19 falls marginally, is very small – one percent, where as the further proportion achieving full level 2 with no English/maths is 8%.

The quality of provision in FE colleges is rising in Lincolnshire but more slowly than in the rest of the region. Between 2005 and 2006 the success rates rose by 1.4% compared to 2.6% in the East Midlands. Success rates are lower overall in Lincolnshire (73%) than those in the region (76%).

The picture is a mixed one when the key priorities of full level 2 and full level 3 success rates are examined. Lincolnshire FE colleges increased their level 2 success rates by 2.5% between 2005 and 2006 to 71%. This is a slower increase than that of the region (4.6%) but Lincolnshire's success rate is higher than that of the region. For level 3, the improvement was 5.6% compared to 3.6% in the region and the actual success rate (70%) is above that of the region (69%).

Issues for consideration/improvement.

- It will be important to ensure that there is sufficient training supply in health and social work, retail distribution, business services and education sectors, Caring occupations, Sales and Teaching/research to meet forecast demand and that young people are made aware of these opportunities
- Future commissioning of training places in sectors such as textiles, manufacturing and computing will need to match falling demand and young people will need to be made aware of the changing demand patterns.
- Participation in education of 16 and 17 year olds need to improve, and the drop out between 16 and 17 needs to change.
- Overall FE success rates for 16-18 year olds living in the Local Authority area need improvement.

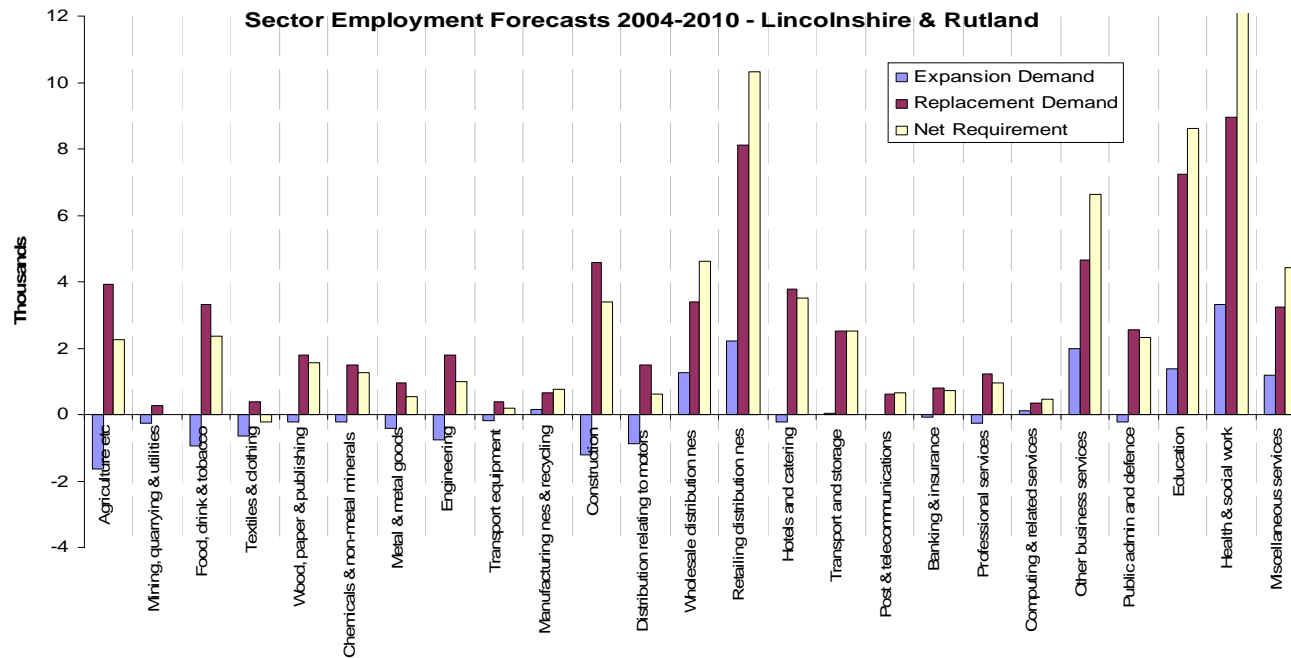

Sector and Occupation Forecasts - Working Futures 2

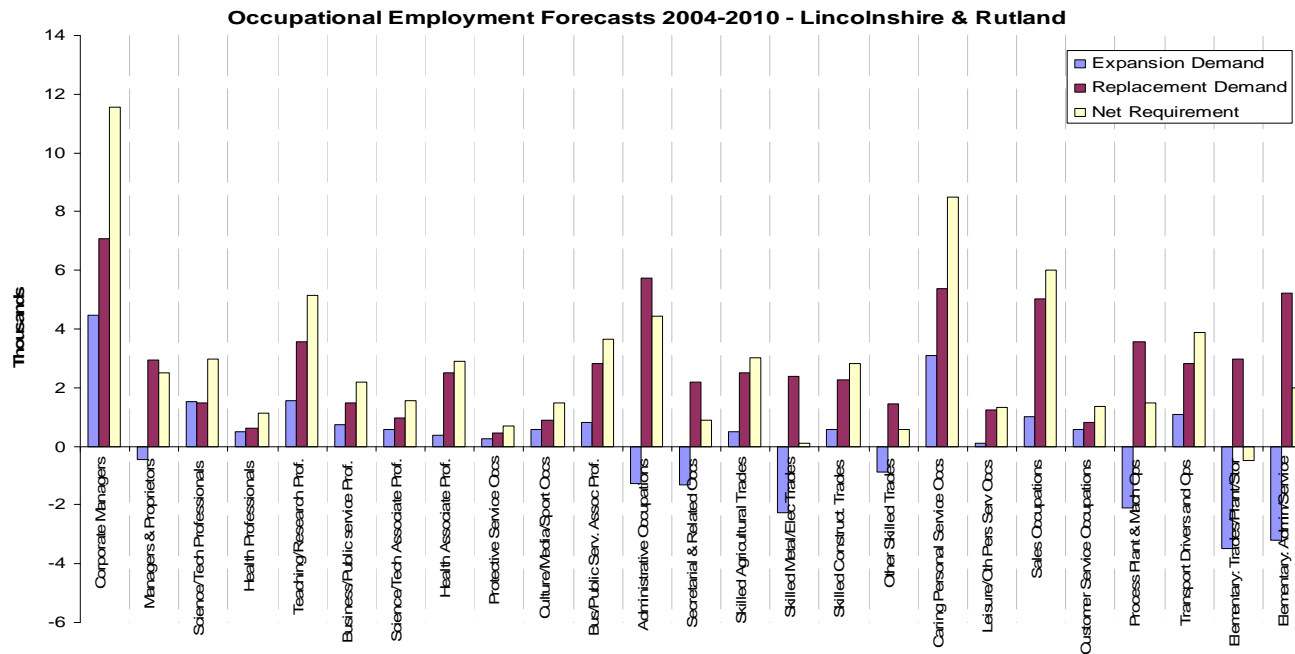

Working Futures II is an economic forecasting model. It uses data from 1981-2004 to generate trends in employment by sector and occupation. The resulting figures are estimates based on these various data sources and assumptions made by the model's creators. They do not take account of recent developments or area specific issues, such as London 2012 or other major regeneration and housing developments. Analysis of the Working Futures data does provide a very useful measure of demand at a regional and area level and is one of the only sources available. However, while it is highly regarded as a valuable source, the estimates must be used responsibly and in their appropriate context.

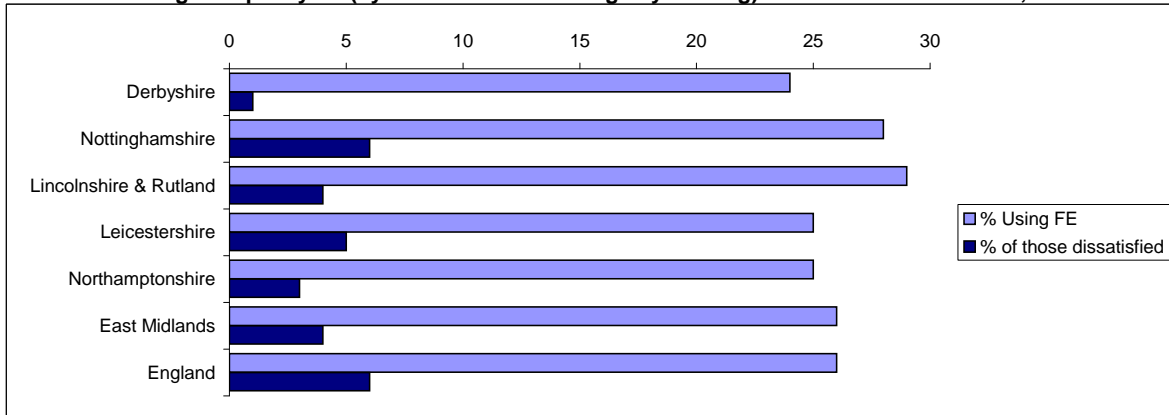

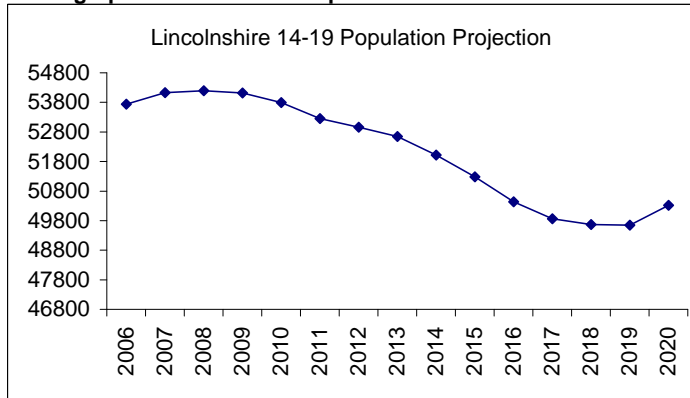

Demographics 2008-2013 - Population Growth

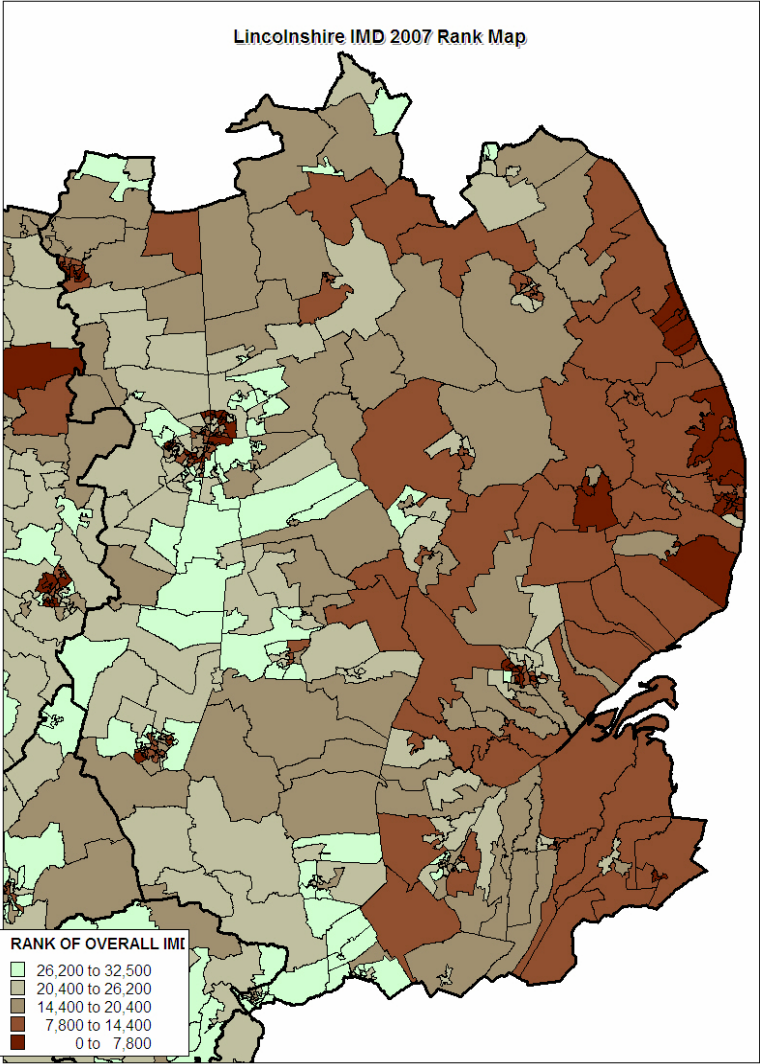
