

## City College Norwich recognised for excellence

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The Learning and Skills Council (LSC) has accredited City College Norwich for delivering high quality training to employers in the region. The college is one of the first training providers in the Eastern region to reach the new standards set by the LSC.

The new standards highlight excellence in provider responsiveness to employer needs and provider excellence in a particular vocational area. Training providers in the UK who reach these new standards will receive a voluntary quality mark of accreditation which will be recognised by employers.

Graham Brough, Area Director for LSC Norfolk, said: "I would like to congratulate City College Norwich for being the first training provider in Norfolk to be accredited for its exceptional services. The accreditation is a mark of excellence and an outstanding achievement which demonstrates a consistent effort by the college to provide excellent training to employers across the county. Training is essential to any successful enterprise and we are determined to make high quality skills training such as that offered by City College Norwich accessible for all across the county."

Examples of training providers who have applied to receive this accreditation so far are colleges, universities, commercial and publicly funded training organisations and large employers. Including City College Norwich, there are currently 26 training providers in the UK who have reached the new standard. This figure is likely to grow as more providers continue to apply and be accessed.

A key development of the standard from previous accreditation schemes is that it is not attached to public funding or investment and will be open to both publicly and privately funded organisations providing higher and further education.

### **CoVEs (Centres of Vocational Excellence) and the new standard:**

CoVEs increase the provider's capacity to deliver vocational or sector based training. They often involve a partnership between LSC funded providers. The CoVE Programme will run until 2010.

The new standard however, is a voluntary quality mark available to any type of provider. It complements the Framework for Excellence (FFE), the LSC's new compulsory, annual, quality assessment, as it contains an assessment of employer responsiveness.

The new standard will feed into National Skills Academies as they will work with providers who have achieved the new standard as their delivery partners.
