### **Norfolk Big Skill winners announced!**

The winners of Norfolk's Big Skill Awards 2009 were announced on Monday June 8 at a ceremony held outside the Forum in Norwich.

Run by the Learning and Skills Council (LSC) in partnership with BBC Radio Norfolk, The Big Skill Awards recognise and reward people who have improved their life or the lives of others through learning.

The winner of the overall award for excellence, chosen from the winners of each category, was 16-year-old Abigail Moore – who also won the 14-16 Learner Award.

Abigail, from Norwich, has overcome problems at school and a serious illness to take control of her life, and judges described her as “brave and inspiring”.

“She is determined and dedicated, and has even been able to talk about her experiences to other students and is a great role model to other people,” they added.

Harry Bunting, from King's Lynn, won the Skills for Work Award for successfully retraining and overcoming dyslexia.

The 21-year-old swapped repairing car bodywork for a hairdressing apprenticeship after he was made redundant, and the judges praised his attitude during a “great personal journey”.

“Harry is a great example of successfully going from one career to a very different one. He has overcome fear of others' comments and reactions to succeed,” they added.

The winners were announced on Monday at an outdoor awards ceremony that was open to the public to attend. Winners were presented with a certificate, trophy and a £150 experience day voucher by BBC Sport presenter Ray Stubbs, who returned to Norwich to present the awards after launching The Big Skill in January this year.

The awards ceremony followed a day-long showcase event outside the Forum, where people could try their hand at different skills taught by colleges and training providers in Norfolk, including climbing, juggling, cookery and carpentry. There were also stage demonstrations and performances from learners across the county, such as dancing and musical theatre from City College Norwich and Great Yarmouth College, and a dog agility show from Easton College.

The Norfolk winners of the Apprenticeship Awards 2009, also run by the LSC, also received their awards at the ceremony. Craig Welford was named Apprentice of the Year, with The Wish Hair Ltd winning Employer of the Year.

Martyn Weston, Assistant Editor for BBC Norfolk, said: "We are delighted to be involved with the Big Skill 2009 and congratulate all those who have both won awards and have reached the finals of such an important event. It is a real honour for BBC Norfolk to be involved with the LSC in recognising learning."

Graham Brough, Area Director at LSC Norfolk, said The Big Skill had done a great job of raising awareness of the learning and training opportunities on offer in Norfolk.

"It's been wonderful to celebrate and recognise the real achievements of learners across the county," he added.

"The Big Skill winners should be an inspiration to others and show that it is possible to overcome challenges and learn new skills that can open doors and change lives for the better."
