Key Points to Note:

- As for all Train to Gain funding, learners with no prior Level 2 qualifications are eligible for full funding on both Level 2 and Level 3 courses.
- If a learner already has a Level 2, they can get funding for doing a Level 3. This is full funding if they are aged 19-24, or partial funding with an expected employer contribution of 42.5% if they are aged 25 or over.
- This includes volunteers, as well as employees, subject to all normal Train to Gain eligibility criteria.
- Many people delivering IAG services may already have Level 2 and 3 qualifications so would appear to be ineligible for TtG funding. However, the Level 2 qualifications **are** included on the list of eligible 'repeats', and therefore would still be fully fundable, regardless of prior qualifications held.
