

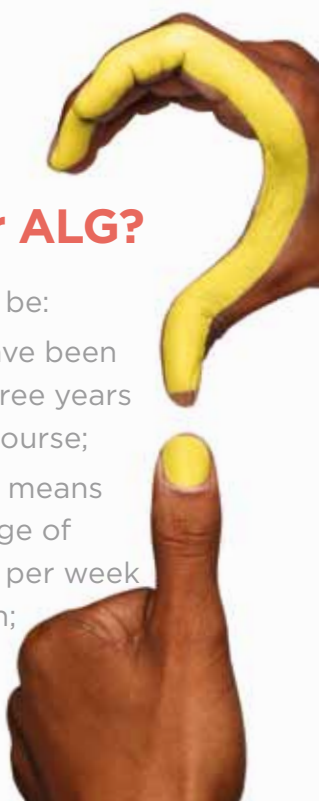
## Are you eligible for ALG?

To get ALG, you need to be:

- aged 19 or over and have been living in England for three years prior to starting your course;
- learning full time - this means a course with an average of 12 hours' guided study per week throughout its duration; usually this is over an academic year;
- doing your first full Level 2 or first full Level 3 qualification (includes BTEC, NVQ, GCSE and A-level);
- earning £19,513 or less if you are single, or £30,810 or less if you are married or living with someone as if you are married;
- not receiving out-of-work benefits or Income Support; and
- not on an apprenticeship or programme-led apprenticeship.

## Gain new skills and qualifications

You can use ALG to study for a wide range of qualifications, including BTECs, NVQs, GCSEs and A-levels,\* in a wide range of subjects from business to construction, science to hairdressing and childcare to publishing. Many people who go back to college later in life find themselves more focused and determined - so you'll probably have a better idea of what subjects you'd like to study too.
